Lab Rats (Jerlindsey)

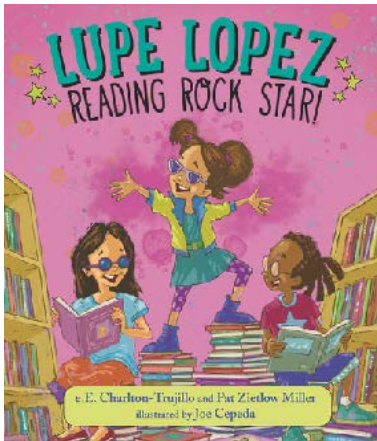
Kids will be doing various Science projects and experiments with staff and peers.

K-1



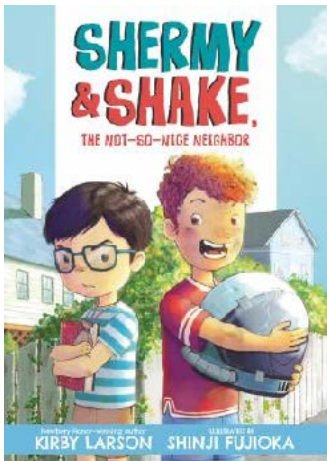
